


Exercise 5: CSS Box Model

The box model is a way of containing content in CSS. The box model includes declarations for **Margins**, **Padding**, **Borders**, **Width**, and **Height**.

Here is an example of a box created using CSS.

For this exercise, using CSS create 10 distinctly different boxes. Experiment with borders, margins, sizes and contents. Use colors for different borders, background images, or font styles. Hint: Try experimenting with size and overflow.

Your finished HTML document should have 10 different boxes and a style sheet with 10 classes.
